PHOTOGRAPHIC EXHIBITION IN 3D.

The exhibition, "Virtually Visionary" from North American artist Ellen Sandor, will be on exhibition until October the 9th.

North American artist, Ellen Sandor has dedicated the last years of her life to make sculptures with new visual media.

She came to Panama, to present her artistic innovation of three-dimensional (3D) photographs, for her exhibition "Virtually Visionary" (12 pieces), at Arteconsult Gallery, which is going open until October the 9th, from 10:00a.m. to 7:00p.m.

As a consequence of her enterprising artistic behavior, it was at the beginning of the '80's when she started to integrate photography with her other abilities to create art, and came together with a group of scientists, technologists and thinkers that creates a new visual media called PHSColograms, in which you are able to see images in 3D without using the lenses to see this technique.

Sandor is also the founder and director of the (art)n, an artistic laboratory in Chicago, of photographs, holograms, sculpture and computer graphics where they create these new forms of visual art.

Sandor explains that the messages of her 3D photographs have inspiration from several sources, for example, the designs of architecture works by Ludwig Mies Van der Rhode and Antonio Gaudi, even she has received some requests from painters such as Robert Lostutter, Mr. Imagination and Carla Gannis, and so they can turn their artworks into 3D photographs.

Some artworks that came from proposals are "Future Perfect", "Passive Erschliessung", "Red Man", "Ocean of Change", "Nascent", "The Third Eye of Mr. I", and they are in exhibition in Arteconsult, at its new location on Calle 72 San Francisco, entering by the Hyundai of Calle 50.
